I asked Greg "what do you like about the Knights of Columbus" and Greg's answer was "Helping others"--and that he does. You can find Greg helping out at St. Thomas More counting the monies after mass, or working at the local food pantry, stocking shelves and helping families in need, or at any of the Knights of Columbus food events.

Greg does a lot for our community, and we are fortunate to have him within the ranks of the Knights of Columbus.
